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2008 PSC Memorial Day Raft-Up Hal Moore

afting-up is the colloquial term when cruising yachtsmen get together and sail to an "exotic" destination, anchor, and tie their boats together into a "raft." It is normally accompanied by festive food and drink once the raft is set. Some rafts get so large and complex that they have barges with bands on them.

PSC normally rafts with five to eight boats in the Chesapeake Bay. Often we are joined by PSC members who own their own boats, and our rafts build to more than a dozen boats! The second night we stay at a marina and enjoy dinner together in a local restaurant. The third day we set sail for our home ports.

For this year's PSC Memorial Day Raft-up, May 24th to May 26th, we will be rafting in the Wye East River, which is on the Eastern Shore of Maryland, on the eastern side of Eastern Bay and north of St. Michaels. We will then sail to St. Michaels for our Sunday night dinner. St.



Michaels is a quaint community on the Eastern Shore, with a wonderful maritime museum, historic lighthouse, and lots of unique restaurants and shops. The shoreline of this area is lined with historic estates.

Our first day is normally spent sailing as boats gradually work their way to the rafting site. The largest boat normally anchors first. The skipper of the largest boat is normally considered the "Raft Captain" and it is primarily on his or her anchor or anchors that the raft relies. As the boats arrive at the raft site, they normally "blossom ship" by hauling up their decorations, flags, and donning costumes that are in keeping with the raft up theme.

This year's theme is "International" where each boat will adopt the identity of a country, and adopt a motif for their nationality. We are liberal on what is considered a "country" as the definition does not necessarily imply that the "country" must have

Training Corner Roger Hammer

he Winter Training Program wraps up in early April with Red Cross CPR/First Aid classes. This year we are offering the combined classes on Saturday, 5 April and again on Saturday, 12 April. Unlike previous years, classes will be conducted at the TESST College, 6315 Bren Mar Drive, Alexandria, VA 22312 instead of the Red Cross Office at Ft Belvoir. CPR will be conducted from 8:30 AM to Noon, and First Aid will run from 1:00 PM to approximately 4 PM. The fee is \$35 for the two classes. This represents a savings of over \$70.00 from the fees Red Cross normally charges for these two classes if you sign up for them on your own. All the details and directions to the TESST are posted on the PSC web site. Please contact the Winter Training Program coordinator, Bill Mahoney to sign up for CPR and First Aid.

On Thursday March 27th from 6:30 pm to 8:30 pm there will be a meeting for all current Bay Skipper Candidates and anyone interested in learning more about the program in the Beatley Library Meeting Room in Alexandria. The purpose of the meeting is to provide an overview of the Bay Skipper Program for new members and discuss changes to the program for 2008. This meeting was rescheduled from the original 11 March date which was cancelled at the last minute.

The 2008 sailing season is fast approaching and we are in the process of recruiting both Lead and Assistant Instructors to teach the Beginning Keelboat Classes scheduled for May, June and September. Serving as a guaranteed a check has be Bay Training baytraining information.

River Training Instructor is a terrific way to sharpen your basic sailing skills and acquire on-the-water sailing time creditable toward your Senior Crew qualification. On Saturday, April 26th, we will be holding a River Instructor Training Clinic for all members interested in teaching the Beginning Keelboat classes. Anyone who has earned their B-KBS+ qualification within the past year is eligible to serve as an Assistant Instructor. If you are interested in serving as an instructor this year, please contact the River Training Coordinator, Jim Mead at rivertraining@pentagonsailing.org.

The first Bay Training Sails for the season are scheduled for the weekend of 26 and 27 April. We will be using boats from ABC Charters again this year which is located over at Port Annapolis Marina. This season we have sails scheduled on at least two weekends per month from May through October including 3 night sails. The cost of a one day bay sail is \$135.00 (\$110.00 with an FVSM). This is a \$15.00 reduction over last year's prices. Spaces on Bay Training Sails can be reserved with a deposit of just \$50.00 with the balance due 30 days before the sail date. Sail dates, the size and type of boat and the names of the skippers for all sails are available on the Cruising Skipper (Bay) page on the PSC website. This year, all checks and Bay Activity Registration Forms should be mailed directly to the PSC Treasurer, Larry Paulson. You are not guaranteed a space on a sail until your check has been received. a seat at the United Nations.

But it needs to be an "entity" with an identifiable culture. For example, Puerto Rico, Hawaii, Quebec, and Texas might be good candidates for "countries." However, New Jersey would not make the cut.

This year will add a new touch to the raft up. Each skipper will E-mail to the other skippers the answers to a set of trivia questions about which country his or her boat will be. Each boat will try to guess the "national" identity of the other boats, and must place a cell phone or VHF call to the raft coordinator identifying the top three ranked guesses as to the country of each boat. These guesses must be submitted before each boat enters the Wye River.

After securing the raft, each boat starts cooking and bringing up their food and refreshments. Normally, each crew eats on their own boat, but soon participants begin to walk around the other boats, sampling their food, drink, and music.

A representative from each boat joins the Raft-up Coordinator to form an awards committee to decide on prizes. These normally include:

> Best Food Best Costumes Best Boat Decorations: Best Ambience (music, attitude, energy) Best Overall

A member of the awards committee may not vote for their own boat. The prize awards are announced at the Sunday night dinner in port.

After the festivities and weather permitting, all crews normally settle down and sleep the night. The next morning everyone awakens leisurely and the boats at the extreme end of the raft break the raft and either maneuver out for sailing, or head to the Sunday night in port destination.

This year we will be mooring at the Harbour Inn at St. Michaels, which is a luxury resort in St. Michaels. It has swimming pools, a Spa, a water shuttle to the other side of the harbor, and free bikes for marina users to go around town with. We will be eating at the Town Dock Restaurant, where we will have our own seating and a great view of the harbor. After dinner, we normally sleep onboard our boats pierside.

The next day, crewmembers can wait around and spend time in town, or head back to their home ports.

The advertised cost of the raft-up is to defray the cost of chartering the boats. The normal cost of a boat for the three day weekend is \$1,500-\$2,500. Money for the meal is collected separately. The cost of marina slips is paid by each boat and is normally split among crew members, as well as the fuel and pump out costs.

If you are bringing your own boat, there is no cost other than the marina fees and the cost of the dinner. However, you need to let the Raft-Up Coordinator know before 1 April in order to have enough slips available.

urrent State Boating Course Requirements (information extracted from *Chesapeake Bay Magazine*).

Delaware: Required for boaters born on or after January 1, 1978.

Maryland: Required for boaters born on or after July 1, 1972.

Pennsylvania: Required for boaters 12-15 years old and all personal watercraft users.

Virginia: Required for personal watercraft users ages 14 and 15.

District of Columbia: Required for all boaters.
